





TB BURDEN


- Quezon City population may have as many as 15,000 active TB cases
- 7,100 cases are sputum positive
- An estimated 3,000 new sputum positive cases are added every year
- Each case infects 5- 10 persons

(Based on the data from 1997 National Prevalence Survey)

QC Ordinance SP 1582, s.2005


An ordinance directing all drugstores and pharmacies including its owners, managers and employees to strictly enforce the "No Prescription, No Dispensing of Anti-TB Drugs Policy" and providing penalties for violations

• QC Ordinance SP 1683, S. 2006

An ordinance promulgating *QC Sagip Baga Program* providing its implementing mechanisms, appropriating funds therefor, and for other purposes


Sagip Baga QC

Others	2.6








• QC Ordinance 1845, s.2008

An ordinance instituting a Comprehensive and Unified Policy for the Tuberculosis Control Implementation in Quezon City

Five (5) components of DOTS strategy

- Direct Sputum Smear examination shall be the initial diagnostic tool in case finding
- 2. Effective drug supply & management system in accordance with NTP
- 3. **Recording & Reporting** of cases shall be on the standardized NTP implemented in all health centers
- 4. **Direct Observed Treatment (DOT)** shall be used as a strategy to ensure patient compliance
- Political commitment to ensure sustained, comprehensive implementation of NTP activities




Multi-Sectoral Alliance for TB Free QC
