 Offers unique research, training and educational opportunities to Asian researchers, practitioners, and policy makers to enhance their capabilities for advancing and applying knowledge on critical issues of global environmental change and risk reduction in the Asia-Pacific.

Highlights

- 13 Fellowships awarded from seven countries throughout Asia.
- Fellowship residencies at Host Institutions in the Philippines, Japan, and Taiwan.
- Inception Meeting to introduce Fellows, meet Host institutions, and begin to build a collaborative network.
- > Competitive call for proposals for four
- Fellows to pursue follow-on project grants for exploratory research, trainings, or workshops.
- Culmination conference to share experiences and learning outcomes and develop further collaborations.

Suffered **167,741.8** billion Rupiah of loss and damage due to disasters between 2000 and 2014


More than **258,000** schools in Indonesia **75%** schools located in disaster prone areas ...

67% of the population are concentrated in coastal urban areas




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DRR Milestones in Education Sector



School-based Disaster Preparedness/ School Safety Program



....only minority of schools **(15,79%)** were "ready" in terms of policy to prepare for disaster...

....SSB program using **top-down** approach→ implemented by government or NGO...

...a **sense of dependency** on external actors to conduct evacuation drills or DRR activities....


...many SSB schools did not **continue** the DRR activities...

... *leadership* of the school principal is important for the sustainability of the program...
