

43 project sites in 17 regions in Luzon, Visayas, and Mindanao


Philippine Plan of Action to Control Tuberculosis (PhilPACT), 2010–2016

Our strategic approaches

PhilPACT as guiding framework for providing technical assistance (TA)

Focus on local government units with low CDR – low CR NTP performance

Work with DOH-Centers for Health Development as the prime TA providers

Provide TA through collaboration with/among partners and USAID CAs

Why engage the League of Cities of the Philippines

In support of PhilPACT, LGUs are enjoined to-

Provide leadership in developing and implementing a local TB control program, plan, and policies

Mobilize finances for the TB program

Ensure a trained TB team: physician, nurse, medical technologist

Ensure an adequate stock of anti-TB drugs and supplies

Why engage the League of Cities of the Philippines

Implement the quality assurance system for TB laboratory services

- Collect, analyze, and use TB data for local program management
- Build partnerships with other government agencies, NGOs, and private entities for comprehensive implementation of the TB program
- Invest in continuing quality improvement through certification and PhilHealth accreditation of DOTS facilities

Service Delivery

- ▶ Inadequate coverage of microscopy labs especially in GIDA and areas with IPs
- Stock-out of drugs and reagents
- Inadequate number of trained treatment partners
- Private providers not practicing DOTS
- ► No functional TBDC
- Facilities without sputum collection areas
- Low health seeking behaviour among symptomatic
- High defaulter and failure rates
- Hospitals not implementing DOTS
- Poor recording and reporting

Financing

- Inadequate budgets for TB
- > No provisions for health promotion, travelling expenses for treatment partners
- PhilHealth reimbursement not utilized
- Low coverage of PhilHealth
- Low availment of reimbursements

Regulation

- ► Facilities not certified or accredited under TB OPB of PhilHealth
- Hospitals and private microscopy labs not complying with DOH 2007-AO 0019
- Over-the counter dispensing of TB drugs

Governance

- Inadequate supervision of treatment partners
- Other partners not mobilized for TB control activities
- ▶ No policies supportive of TB control; some LGUs with policies but not implemented
- Inadequate monitoring, supervision, and evaluation activities

Human Resource Development

- Untrained MedTechs and DOTS providers
- Facilities without microscopists
- No human resource development plan

Information Systems

- Late reporting of accomplishments
- Misclassifications in recording
- No computers and trained personnel
- Lack of capabilities to analyze and use NTP information

IMPACT TA Plan for 2014

Component 1 Increase demand for TB services

- Mobilize and strengthen communities, and public and private providers into networks of TB IEC providers
- Build advocacy capacity of national, regional, LGU, and local managers of the TB control program
- Develop new and expand existing behavior change communication models for vulnerable groups

SUBJECT: <u>Amendment to Administrative Order No.2006-0026 on the</u> <u>Implementing Guidelines in the Conduct of National</u> <u>Tuberculosis Control Program – Directly Observed Treatment</u> <u>Short-Course (NTP-DOTS) Certification.</u>

Since the adoption of the Directly Observed Treatment Short-Course (DOTS) Strategy in 1996, significant progress in addressing the Tuberculosis (TB) burden has been achieved by the National TB Control Program (NTP). The tread of the burden has been rate (CR) time.

Highlights of Progress october 2013 to MAY 2014 Increase demand for and utilization of quality TB control services and MDR/XDR TB management and treatment

Ensured patient support and TB treatment completion by

- Training of trainors on IPCC for RHU doctors/nurses/midwives in San Juan, Las Pinas, Marikina, Malabon and Makati
- Roll Out Training of front line health workers (midwives/BHWs/volunteers) on IPCC in Pasay, San Juan, Marikina and Quezon City and social workers in Mandaluyong
- Enhancing the Skills of Midwives as Supervisors of Treatment Partners (Malabon, Taguig, San Juan, Caloocan, Mandaluyong, Valenzuela and Las Pinas)
